#### **VENDORS: FILL AN IMPORTANT ROLE**

- Ownership of livestock common in urban areas (80% overall) – continuous and temporal
- Move forage from rural to urban areas
- Hundreds at minimum in Sahelian cities?



















### **QUANTITIES AND TYPES**

- Mainly forage from natural range, crop residues: cowpea and groundnuts
- Some improved forage
- From traders bringing in hay to to small vendors bringing in by bike





































#### **QUALITY AND PRICE**

- Great diversity, from low quality natural fodder to highquality crop residues
- Price-quality relationship some work conducted, e.g., Ayantunde and Grings
- Cowpea and groundnut hulms more expensive
- Large seasonal variability in price
